- More diversity in faculty
 - Consumers, family members, and people of color on panels as faculty and as co-facilitators for small group sessions
 - Faculty from across the U.S. representing urban, suburban, rural and frontier areas
- More money raised to support the Summit
 - A 100% increase in funds raised
